

## Guidelines for Publication

Jenny's family has encouraged the broad release of her case on the Internet and other media, for the sole purpose of locating and making contact with the doctors and families of others who have experienced similar symptoms and treatments (so-called "near comparables").

The family's privacy is a significant concern. There is no desire to turn Jenny into a poster child for any of the many anti-Gardasil campaigns, either on the extreme left or right, or to politicize Jenny's case in any way. While there is concern on the part of some of her physicians that her Gardasil injections **could** have had a triggering-effect, **there is no medical or scientific evidence connecting her condition to Gardasil** at this time.

If you republish Jenny's case, or post any materials related to Jenny, we request that you follow the guidelines listed below.

1. Do not include Jenny's full name in any public postings or communications.
2. Jenny's parents are both respected professors at a leading university. Please do not refer to them by name, or identify the institution.

6. Please include the list of comparable characteristics:

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| Am I a Comparable? A List of Comparable Traits, from most relevant to least <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. Has had similar rapid weakening, going from healthy to paralyzed very quickly</li><li>b. Teenage girl, with recent onset of menses (periods)</li><li>c. Have had similar treatments: IVIG, plasmapheresis, multiple forms of steroids and Cytoxin (an immunosuppressant), a "mitochondrial</li></ol> |
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cocktail" of antioxidants, and lithium and riluzole  
d. Recent HPV vaccine  
e. Possibly family history of neural diseases, such as seizures and/or palsies  
f. Possibly had an auto-immune condition in the past, such as a rare skin condition like pityriasis lichenoides  
g. Possible heavy-metal exposure, for example aluminum or environmental mercury exposure.
